Realizing Your Spirituality

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INTRODUCTION:

- i. Conversion is a process, not a miraculous event Eph. 4:21-24
 - It can be a great disappointment after obeying the gospel
 - It involves putting off, being renewed and putting on
 - God removes the sin, but we must let His Spirit, through the word, change our lives
 - Conversion involves taking us out of the world and the world out of us
- ii. Becoming a Christian through is equated to the idea of being "born again" John 3:3-5
 - Babes are not born full grown
 - Growth takes time
 - Growth is expected 2 Pet. 3:18
 - Just as bodily growth requires food and nourishment, so does spiritual growth
- iii. The question I would like to challenge every soul in this room who believes they are a Christian is "Have I realized my spirituality or am I very much so merely a carnal man?" 1 Cor. 3:1-2
 - Illustrate with my own conversion experience
 - Difference between knowing and realizing I knew it, but did not realize it
 - Until we move beyond mere knowledge and start realizing our faith, our Christianity will be superficial. We will never realize our full potential in Christ.

DISCUSSION:

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I. IS MY <u>WORSHIP</u> WITH MY LIPS ONLY OR WITH ALL OF MY HEART AND SPIRIT?

- A. There is an attitude in worship that is offensive to God Matt. 15:8
 - 1. Is our worship focused and intense (distracted with cares or completely absorbed)?
 - 2. Are our prayers deep and impassioned or hollow and empty?
 - 3. Does our song originate in the heart, or merely from the lips?
 - 4. Are we deeply moved at the weekly remembrance of His death or is it a shallow and meaningless ritual?
 - Worship is not only to be truthful, it is to be spiritual 1 Cor. 14:15; John 4:23-24

II. IS MY <u>STUDY OF THE BIBLE</u> A BURDEN OR A JOY?

- A. God desires us to learn from Him Matt. 11:28-30
 - 1. Do you consider yourself a disciple of Christ? cf. John 8:31
 - 2. What is the extent of your Bible study (just within these walls, prepared for class, daily, weekly, rarely)?
 - 3. Do you study because you have to or do you study because you want to?
 - 4. How do your study habits impact others?
 - Spirituality involves diligence with God's word 2 Tim. 2:15

III. ARE <u>MY TREASURES</u> LAID UP ON EARTH OR IN HEAVEN?

- A. Where are the things you value most? Luke 12:30-34
 - 1. What is it that we labor for most in this world? cf. Prov. 13:7
 - 2. What is more important to you—rich in money or rich in good works?
 - 3. Do our treasures distract us from God or draw us closer to Him?
 - 4. Are the cares and riches of this world choking the seed in our hearts and causing us to be unfruitful?
- B. Realizing your spirituality means realizing money's proper place in your life! **1 Tim. 6:6-11, 17-19**

IV. DO <u>I PRIORITIZE</u> GOD FIRST IN MY LIFE?

- A. What place do the kingdom of God and His righteousness really take in my life? Matt. 6:33
 - 1. Do I prioritize them before food, drink and clothing?
 - 2. Does God take a back seat to recreational activities?
 - 3. Does God take a back seat to worldly pursuits?
 - 4. Are we really just nothing more than closet idolaters in denial?
 - Spiritual people leave no doubt as to who is first in their lives! Jas. 4:4-5

V. DO <u>MY ACTIONS</u> CONFORM TO THIS WORLD OR MANIFEST A TRANSFORMED LIFE?

- A. What do others see in me by the way I live my life? Rom. 12:1-2
 - 1. What kind of humor do I engage in?
 - 2. What kind of entertainment do I enjoy?
 - 3. What kind of clothes do I wear?
 - 4. What kind of people do I enjoy being around?
 - 5. What kind of places do I like to go to?
 - 6. What kind of things do I like to talk about?
- B. Are men glorifying God as a result of what they see in me? Matt. 5:16
