Lesson1 – A Study of the Holy Spirit Who Is the Holy Spirit?

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Introduction: What do you think of when you hear about the Holy Spirit?

- A. There is much confusion on this very fundamental Bible subject! Every Christian is expected to know about the Holy Spirit!
 - 1. We must know about Him before we are baptized. (Acts 2:38; 19:1-5)
 - 2. The knowledge of the Spirit's indwelling is motivation for us to live for the Lord. (1 Cor 6:19-20)
- B. When we study about the Holy Spirit we will learn more about the character of God.
 - 1. We have an essential need to know what God wants of us.
 - 2. The great work of the Holy Spirit is to communicate God's will to us in understandable words.

ASV 1 Corinthians 2:13 Which things also we speak, not in words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Spirit teacheth; combining spiritual things with spiritual *words*.

I. Who is God?

- A. The Holy Spirit is God.
 - 1. When you lie to the Holy Spirit, you have lied to God. (Acts 5:3-4)
 - 2. When you read of passages describing the Triune God, this makes the Holy Spirit an equal with the Father and the Son (1 Jn 5:7)
 - 3. These persons or being comprise the one true God.
- B. When we study about the Holy Spirit we will learn about the Triune God or "Trinity".
 - 1. How many passages speak of the "Father, Son and Holy Spirit?" (Mt 28:18-19; 2 Cor 13:14)
 - 2. Can you explain what this means? Let us learn more about our God!
- C. But the Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son. They are separate beings!
 - 1. The Father sent the Holy Spirit upon Jesus at His baptism. (Mt 3:16-17)
 - 2. Jesus would later send the Holy Spirit to the apostles. (Jn 14:26; 15:26)
 - 3. Let us accept these truths knowing that we cannot fully explain the spiritual nature of God in the words of our limited experience.

II. The Holy Spirit is a person

- A. When I speak of a person I am describing one who thinks, feels and has a character. Consider several things that the Holy Spirit does.
 - 1. He speaks. (1 Tim 4:1)
 - 2. He can be grieved. **(Eph 4:30)**
 - 3. He can be lied to. (Acts 5:3-4)
 - 4. He submits to the Father and the Son. (14:26; 15:26; 16:13)
- B. The Holy Spirit is not then a "gas or a liquid or a magnetic field!"
 - 1. Some have denied the Holy Spirit is a person. (Ex. Jehovah's Witnesses)
 - 2. Others have made the Holy Spirit nothing more than a gas that may "fill" an

object! No He is a person with personality!

III. The Holy Spirit has a work

- A. As Jesus was leaving this world He prepared His disciples for the Spirit's great work. (Jn 16:7-13)
 - 1. His great work was delivering the word of God to inspired men once for all time! (Eph 3:3-5; Jude 3)
 - 2. These men who revealed God's new message did so without error. (Jn 14:26; Mt 10:18-20)
- B. We are the readers of this work and not inspired ourselves!
 - 1. This is God's plan for every man to submit to this perfect word that was delivered. (Gal 1:6-10)
 - 2. We now must use this word to "test the spirits" if it is from God. We must appeal to the words of inspired men! (1 Jn 4:1,6)
 - 3. When teachers claim the Holy Spirit gives a message apart from the written word, then they are preparing one to go beyond what is written. (1 Cor 4:6)
 - 4. When a false teacher can break ones strict following of God's word, then they can lead them anywhere! Consider how many come to be Mormons.
- C. The Holy Spirit continues a work today in helping us to pray. (Rom 8:26-27)
 - 1. Here He takes what we are trying to say and deliverers it to the Father on our behalf!
 - 2. What if we do not pray or have wrong motives? (Jas 4:2-3)
- D. Is the Holy Spirit working in our lives?
 - 1. It is very possible for us to fight and stop His great work. (1 Thess 5:19; Rom 8:13-14)
 - 2. Take this test to see if He is working in your life! (Gal 5:22-23)

IV. Things the Holy Spirit does not do

- A. Bow to meet our selfish requests and interests. (Jas 4:2-3)
 - 1. Some view their flesh as the Holy Spirit. Whatever they want must be what God must give them!
 - 2. Others think that whatever they feel in the flesh must be The Holy Spirit speaking to them. "I can feel the spirit present in this place!"
- B. Continue with the signs used to confirm the word in the 1st century. (Mk 16:17-20)
 - 1. These signs were for a purpose and would come to an end. (1 Cor 13:8-10)
 - 2. When the New Testament was delivered then these special gifts ceased! (Jas 1:25)
 - 3. We now are in the time where men who claim these things are not from God! (Zech 13:1-3)

Conclusion: Let us be strong in God's might using the mighty work of the Holy Spirit. (Eph 6:13, 17)

- A. Are you being tested in your heart by His word? (Heb 4:12-13)
- B. By the Holy Spirit we can see clearly how to serve God and be right with Him!
