#### <u>A Study of the life of Joseph (1)</u> The plan of God and the family of Joseph <u>www.aubeacon.com</u>

*Introduction:* There is a great power in the example of one man.

- A. The apostle Paul knew that his example was a powerful teacher. (1 Cor 11:1; Phil 4:9)
  - 1. How do you feel when a teacher says one thing but practices another?
  - 2. How encouraging is it to see one standing strong when you are battling to stand? (Phil 1:12-14) (Ex. Stonewall Jackson, coach on the sidelines)
  - 3. Joseph stood when he was young, middle aged and when he was old!

B. God used this faithful man Joseph in a plan that would eventually include you and me.

- 1. Our study of Joseph will emphasize the powerful God that we serve and the ways he uses and blesses those who are a part of His plan.
- 2. Joseph knew God and as a result everything he did was viewed as being in His sight! (Gen 39:9)
- 3. What does it mean to know God and be a part of His plan?

#### **Discussion:**

- 1. Who has been the greatest influence in your life to follow God? Why?
- 2. Why is an example more powerful than words?
- 3. How can we know that God is with us? How does this help us set a good example?

# I. The plan of God and the life of Joseph

- A. God has a plan to provide for all those who seek Him.
  - 1. After the fall of man the issue of sin became man's greatest problem.
  - 2. Because of sin man could not have fellowship with God. (Rom 3:23; 6:23)
  - 3. Man needed a savior and God had a plan to send Him even before the world was created. (1 Pt 1:20-21)
- B. The plan was revealed in some detail when God called Abraham many years ago.

### (Gen 12:1-3)

- 1. The plan to save all nations would eventually come from specific descendants of Abraham.
- 3. Abraham's grandson, Jacob, was one of those special descendants.

### II. The history and geography of the life of Joseph

- A. Jacob and his sons lived a nomadic life taking care of livestock.
  - 1. This caused them to travel to different areas to find land where the livestock could graze.
  - 2. The land of Canaan had areas to sustain this lifestyle. But due to occasional droughts the people had at times to relocate.

- B. The land of Canaan was near the land of Egypt.
  - 1. Egypt was the most powerful nation on earth at this time.
  - 2. Pharaoh was an absolute dictator whose wish was executed without question.
  - 3. Egypt was a culture that worshipped many God's (including Pharaoh himself).
  - 4. They used a different language, a different alphabet and many different customs.

### III. The home in which Joseph was raised

- A. Joseph was the great-grandson of Abraham. (Mt 1:2; Rom 4:16)
  - 1. Abraham was a great example of faith. However there was a struggle for his descendants to find that kind of faith.
  - Abraham knew to obey God and did so when he came to the land. However there was much more that he would learn when God "tested" him. (Heb 11:8-10; 17-19)
- B. Rachel came from a home where covetousness and deceit was practiced.
  - 1. Rachel's father, Laban, deceived Jacob and caused him to work 14 years because he wished to marry Rachel.
  - 2. Laban would not keep his word and often cheated Jacob and thus his own daughters out of what was due them. (Gen 31:4-7, 14-16)
  - 3. Out of that covetousness came a bitterness when God blessed Jacob.
- C. Joseph's brothers as well as Joseph himself were born in a divided family where Rachel and Leah competed for the affection of Jacob.
  - 1. Having children was like a competition where even the maids of Rachel and Leah were used. (Gen 30:3-13)
  - 2. How would brothers in this kind of home react to each other? Would the son of Leah have a problem with a son of Rachel?
  - 3. With the death of Rachel Jacob's favoritism would increase.
  - 4. These brothers would later use deceit to commit murder in their wrath.

# (Gen 34:13-17, 25-29)

**Discussion:** Make a list of things found in the home of Jacob that made it more difficult for the children to believe in God. Explain your answers!

### IV. Joseph chose to serve God

- A. No doubt he listened and learned from his father.
  - 1. He would know about the promises made to Abraham and Isaac.
  - 2. He also learned about his father's struggles and how he came to humble himself before God. (Gen 32:9-12)
- B. Notice some characteristics of one who served God.
  - 1. He told the truth when his peers would punish him for it. (Gen 37:2)

- 2. He had to bear reproach because of the mistakes of his father. (Gen 37:3-4)
- 3. He did not strike back at his brother or his father because of this. (Rom 12:17-21)
- 4. God gave him messages that would create anger in both his brothers and his father. He spoke them anyway. (Gen 37:5-11)
- 5. In spite of all of this he obeyed his father and did as he asked. (Gen 37:14-17)

#### **Discussion:**

- 1. What wrong attitudes could Joseph have displayed and blamed it on his family? Would this have excused him?
- 2. What made Joseph stand out from his brothers? Was this good for Joseph? (THINK!)
- 3. What should we do when one mistreats us?
- 4. Is it easy walking by faith?
- 5. Why does God allow temptation to come in our lives? (1 Cor 10:12-13)

# V. The fruit of Satan's seeds

- A. Satan is happy when you give in to the works of the flesh. (Gal 5:19-21)
  - 1. What starts out as a small seed of compromise and exceptions grows into a crop of mindless passion that would do anything.
  - 2. This is why uncontrolled anger in the heart makes you a murderer. (1 Jn 3:15)
- B. The assault and enslavement on Joseph. (Gen 37:18-36)
  - 1. How was Joseph described by his brothers? Why?
  - 2. What was their first plan?
  - 3. What was the first thing they did to Joseph?
  - 4. Why did they change their mind the first time?
  - 5. Why did they change their mind the second time? What was the motive?
  - 5. How did they explain all of these things to Jacob?
  - 6. Did they ever tell him the truth before they went to Egypt?

*Discussion:* Look at the family background of these sons and describe how every step they took against Joseph had its seeds in things they saw and learned in the home.
