Lesson 2 – Earning Money

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Introduction: The Lord expects every man to provide for himself and his home.

A. God's word directs man to work and earn a living. Work is honorable.

- 1. God described creation as His "work." (Gen 2:2)
- 2. Before the fall man was involved with work that involved both physical labor and mental labor. (Gen 2:15, 19-20)
- 3. Afterwards God showed the necessity of work and its difficulty. (Gen 3:17-19)
 - a. One of the consequences of Cain's sin was a fruitless labor. (Gen 4:12)
 - b. After the flood the people acknowledged the difficulty of work.
- B. How did God's Son spend the majority of His life? (Mk 6:3)
 - 1. He received training from His father and was with him in that work.
 - 2. Jesus was around 30 years old when He began to preach!
- C. Satan offers us many "alternatives" to work.

I. How can we earn money in a way that pleases God?

- A. God directs us to honest labor. (Eph 4:28; 2 Thess 3:12; Lk 10:7)
 - 1. We can work for another and receive wages.
 - 2. We can have our own business by the principle of exchange (Buying and Selling) (Mt 13:44-45; Acts 16:14)
 - 3. We can investing and receive a share of a business. (Mt 25:27)
 - a. Here we are not *taking from another* but rather *participating in the work*
 - of others. Money can represent *previous work done* to earn that money.
 - b. These things are not arbitrary.
- B. We can honorably receive money by the principle of love. Something is given without expectation of return.
 - 1. We are to give to those in genuine need (Eph 4:28; Acts 2:45, 11:29)
 - 2. We can receive an inheritance. (Lk 15:12)
- C. It is wrong for one to receive from others when <u>we refuse to provide for ourselves</u> or already <u>have the resources to provide for ourselves</u>! (2 Thess 3:7-12)
 - 1. God's wisdom demands that we *take the time to know what we are doing* according to His revealed will. (1 Tim 5:3-4)
 - 2. How does God define being needy? (1 Tim 6:6-8)
 - 3. How do unscrupulous people take advantage of those who do not investigate?
 - 4. Before a church <u>permanently</u> takes care of a widow there are "qualifications." (1 Tim 5:9-12)
 - 5. We can commit sin by *giving some people help* or *seeking help* when we should not! We may well be helping some to buy drugs.
 - 6. Some will seek help from multiple sources and not reveal what they have.
 - 7. God does not wish for the one receiving help have it easy while the giver is bearing heavy burdens. (2 Cor 8:13-15)

II. Dishonorable and dishonest ways of making money

A. There are many "short-cuts" that are presented to you to honest labor. (Prov 10:16)

- 1. You can take advantage of others without them ever knowing. You can rob people who will never know your name or see your face.
- 2. You can do something that has the approval of government and is a common practice in the culture but it still is wrong! (Ex 23:2)

B. Some common "short-cuts."

- 1. By keeping something another lost. (Ex 23:4) (Ex. Emily and lost wallet)
- 2. By making false promises and creating false expectations. (Prov 11:18)
- 3. By intentionally lying about what you are selling.

(Job 31:6; Prov 16:11; Amos 8:4-6)

- 4. By failing to pay a just wage. (Mal 3:5; James 5:1-4)
- 5. By charging exorbitant interest rates. (Prov 22:16, 22-23; 28:8)
- C. There are some jobs and actions that a Christian cannot participate in.
 - 1. We cannot participate (have fellowship) in what is wrong! Consider working at or expecting to participate in the temple of an idol. (2 Cor 6:14-18)
 - 2. Could a Christian work at an abortion clinic? Serve alcohol? Do something that violates your conscience?
- D. What should be our attitude towards honorable work?
 - 1. The same as God! This is a matter of faithfulness. (2 Thess 3:10-12)
 - 2. When we work God is our boss. We should give our best! (Col 3:22-24)
 - 3. We can steal by failing to do our best.

III. Wisdom while working for money

- A. Go the extra mile in handling money. (2 Cor 8:19-21)
- B. Go the extra mile in your contact and association with the opposite sex.
 - 1. You may have more companionship with a worker that with your mate! (Eph 5:3)
 - 2. Here is where a stand for the Lord will eliminate many problems.
- C. Learn the difference between dedication and being a workaholic
 - 1. Here is where we need to see clearly. (Mt 6:33; Ecc 6:7-9)
 - 2. Men in particular may find their lives completely defined by their work.
- D. Overcoming stress and worry about money.
 - 1. What about the paralyzing fear of not being able to pay the bills? (Mt 6:30-34)
 - 2. We need to be ready to accept the loss of a job with peace. (Phil 4:11-13)
 - 3. Let us face our worry and know that all is well! (Jn 16:33)
