### <u>The Covenants of God</u> Lesson 1 - The Blessing of Having a Covenant With God <u>www.aubeacon.com</u>

Introduction: Everything that God does is a *reflection of His character*.

- A. All of God's actions are designed *to bless His people*. (Deut 6:24-25)
  - 1. Whatever provisions God makes for us is for our good always.
  - 2. Men often pervert and fail to understand God's actions because they do not know God! If God provides and directs then I will trust Him! (Rom 3:4)
- B. When God describes His nature it gives us great confidence in His covenant with us!
  - 1. God will tell us what He will do and be faithful to that! (Deut 7:9; Ex 34:6-7)
  - 2. Those who trust the Lord will *never be ashamed*! (Ps 25:2-3, 20-21)

# I. Some Covenant Basics

- A. God uses the word "covenant" to *describe all relationships to Him*.
  - Covenant διαθήκη diatheke 1) a disposition, arrangement, of any sort, which one wishes to be valid, the last disposition which one makes of his earthly possessions after his death, a testament or will 2) a compact, a covenant, a testament 2a) God's covenant with Noah, etc.
  - 3. Why was a covenant so significant to Noah? (Gen 6:18; Deut 7:12-13)
- B. God's covenant is *unilateral and full of blessings*.
  - 1. God wants man to *know His character* and His desire to bless us.
  - 2. God will only bless us in consistency with His character. We then must be in a teachable relationship so we can <u>know God and His ways</u>! (Ps 25:8-10)
  - 3. God's covenant is delivered in *words that are unchangeable and knowable*!

# II. God's Covenants Reveal His Character and Purposes

- A. God's *covenant with Noah* teaches us about God. (Gen 9:8-16)
  - 1. The sign of this covenant is seen by all today in the rainbow. There are no conditions made upon man to receive the blessing of this covenant!
  - 2. God promises that there will be no future worldwide flood. *He is faithful*.
  - 3. God's wrath will be revealed against sin in another way! <u>God is Holy</u>.
  - 4. Noah did not let others rob him of his fellowship with God. <u>God will bless those</u> <u>that "walk" with Him</u>! (Gen 6:9, 22)
  - 5. Those who honor and follow God's covenant will <u>have a future home with God</u>! (Heb 11:7)
- B. God's covenant with Abraham revealed God's eternal plan for mankind.
  - 1. This covenant had conditional promises for Abraham. (Gen 12:1-3)
  - 2. God commanded that all male descendants of this covenant receive the "sign of the covenant" in circumcision. (Gen 17:10-14)
  - 3. Abraham met the conditions of the covenant by walking by faith. He left his home and walked by faith in this new land. (Gen 15:5-6, 18)
  - 4. The rest of the Bible is the history of How God fulfilled this covenant! (Mt 1:1, 17)
  - 5. God would be faithful even if Abraham's descendants were not! (Deut 9:4-6)

  - C. The *Mosaic covenant was to prepare a people for the Christ* who would come.
    - 1. God remembered His covenant with Abraham and would now make them a great nation. God's power and faithfulness is magnified. (Ex 2:24; 32:11)
    - 2. God prepared His people for a national covenant. These people would now be taught *more fully about the nature of God*. (Ex 19:3-11)
    - 3. The people were taught all the words and the people agreed to keep the covenant. This *covenant was sealed with blood*! (Ex 24:1-8)
    - 4. Those under the covenant should have come to know God and thus see their sin and their need of a savior. *Sacrifice for sin is central*. (Gal 3:20-27)

# III. A covenant with God provides great blessing and assurance

- A. God described His rescue of Israel <u>being like a cast off newborn</u> in a field. (Ezk 16:4-5)
  - 1. We live in a world of "throw-away people." This is *not so with God*.
  - 2. Listen carefully to what our God is like. He wants to heal, cleanse and provide for *the utterly helpless ones*! (Ezk 16:7-13)
  - 3. Some view God's covenants as "rules and legalism." They do not know God.
- B. We must *learn to serve* and *be blessed* by a holy God! (Lev 11:44-45; 19:2; 20:26)
  - 1. Anyone in a covenant of God lives *a lifetime of teaching and change*.
  - 2. What a tragedy when men fear the anger of other men rather that plainly teach the *Holy ways of God*. Blessings and holiness must be found together!
  - 3. Within the paths of holiness are provisions of forgiveness. Many will turn away.
  - 4. Those who yield their spirits to God will find "the secret of the Lord." You will *never regret trusting God.* (Ps 25:12-14)
