# Lesson 2 – How to Apply Bible Authority in a Local Church www.uvachurch.com

**Introduction:** What instructions has God given concerning local churches?

- A. The very first question we must answer is <u>how has God spoken to us</u>?
  - 1. Understanding *the role of the apostles* is crucial to understand how the Lord provides for us in all things! (Jn 17:8, 20)
  - 2. Jesus wanted all to know the men He chose as Apostles. His *future work would be done through them*. Jesus wrote nothing but His apostles did write!
- B. The church came into existence through the preaching of the apostles! (Acts 2:14)
  - 1. They delivered the perfect promises from God to us! (Acts 2:38-39)
  - 2. What were these new Christians <u>now to learn and do</u>? They were to steadfastly stay within the apostle's doctrine! (Acts 2:41-42)

#### I. The New Testament is a perfect guide for local churches

- A. The revealed words of God are a perfect and complete revelation. (2 Tim 3:16-17)
  - 1. This should be no surprise to us because <u>everything that come from God is</u> perfect for the purpose it is given! (2 Sam 22:31)
  - 2. When we believe this, we will carefully listen to God word. (1 Thess 2:13)
- B. When we chose to have the Lord as our head, then we have placed ourselves under His apostles and the words that they delivered in the N.T.! (Eph 4:4-6; Eph 2:20)
  - 1. We are to take *all that has been revealed on a subject* and stay within it.
  - 2. This is the essence of what it means for <u>Jesus to be our Lord!</u> (Lk 6:46)
  - 3. How we view these words will affect what <u>local churches teach and practice</u>!

## II. Jesus taught the apostles how to carefully handle these words

- A. Jesus came to fulfill and teach God's plan *that was delivered to Him*. (Jn 17:4-5)
  - 1. Jesus goal was to glorify the Father. How did He do this?
  - 2. He was given a work that He accomplished. Everything He did pointed to God.
- B. Jesus wanted all to know that to stay within what was revealed would give God glory! He saw God's glory in <u>the application of these words</u>. He is teaching us how to seek God's glory in our lives! (Jn 7:16-18; 12:23, 27-28)
  - 1. God's glory is simply a reflection of God's holiness. We <u>must be told what is</u> <u>holy</u> and then pursue that very thing.
  - 2. Men often seek their own ways and thoughts in order to "glorify God."
- C. Jesus prepared His disciples in how they were to handle these words! (Jn 17:17-19)
  - 1. They would by this be "sanctified" or "set apart" to God's holy path!
  - 2. What a blessing we can when are found in this path!

## III. Churches were established and maintained by the words delivered by the apostles

- A. Jesus worked by the Holy Spirit through the apostles. (Jn 14:24-26)
  - 1. The Holy Spirit would give a perfect remembrance of what Jesus spoke to them.
  - 2. The Holy Spirit would teach them <u>additional things</u> from Jesus. (Jn 16:12-15)

- 3. Just like Jesus, the Holy Spirit would only deliver what He received!
- B. Every Christian was to be taught the foundations God has given. (Eph 2:20; 4:4-6)
  - 1. Consider the "one faith!" This involves both <u>the words delivered through the</u> <u>apostles and our attitudes towards them.</u> (1 Cor 4:6)
  - 2. In a local church if either the "one baptism" or the "one faith" is not taught and practiced then *one's fellowship with God is endangered*. (2 Jn 9-11)
- C. The Apostles simply "handed down" what they had received from Jesus.
  - 1. Pay attention when you see these words: "<u>tradition</u>, <u>delivered</u> and <u>received</u>" (1 Cor 11:2, 23; 15:3; Jude 3)
  - 2. There was a consistent teaching <u>to be applied to all local churches</u>! How have we received this instruction today? (1 Cor 4:17; 7:17; 11:16; 14:33-37)
  - 3. To fail to obey this "tradition" delivered from the apostles is to *forsake Jesus Christ Himself*. (2 Thess 3:3-4, 6, 12, 14)
  - 4. The early church carefully stayed within the apostle's doctrine. If they had no instruction from them *then they did nothing*. (Acts 15:23-24)
  - 5. When an epistle was given to one church it could then be given to other churches and *thus to all generations*. (Col 4:16; 1 Thess 5:27; 2 Pt 3:1-2)

### III. How can we stay within the limits of God's authority?

- A. We must be committed to only acting and teaching when we have positive authority.
  - 1. Jesus *limited Himself* in this very way. (Jn 5:19-21, 30; 8:28-29)
  - 2. Jesus <u>expects us to have this same attitude</u>. (Jn 12:48-50; 17:20)
  - 3. This is <u>how we glorify God</u> and stay within His purposes. (1 Pt 4:11; Col 3:17)
  - 4. I then must give scripture (Book, chapter and verse) for my teaching or practice or *give up that teaching or practice*. We *must have agreement* on this principle!
- B. These truths represent a foundation from which we can build together!
  - 1. There is *more to applying these truths*! Whatever difficulties or inconsistencies men may have in application, let us stay on this foundation!
  - 2. May God help us to keep <u>our eyes fixed upon His delivered words</u> rather than the inconsistent failings of men. (Rom 3:4)

#### **Questions**

- 1. How did Jesus *handle the words* delivered to Him from the Father? How did the Holy Spirit *handle these words*?
- 2. How did the apostles teach local churches *how to apply these words* delivered to them through the apostles? What is *the first question they should ask*?
- 3. What is the difference between those that limit their actions by <u>staying within positive</u> <u>authority</u> and those that are <u>only limited by specific probation</u>?
- 4. Did the apostles expect local churches to have <u>a uniform practice in their beliefs and</u> worship?
- 5. <u>Can we agree</u> to give scripture for a teaching or be willing to give it up?
- 6. How should we react when a man is inconsistent or has a bad attitude? Does that bad attitude *give others the right to reject Bible teaching*?
