#### Faith on the Job

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Introduction: Our Jobs will have a large impact upon our lives!

- A. What we chose to do as a job and where we chose to work are important spiritual decisions in our lives.
  - 1. How much time each week is involved with our jobs?
  - 2. There is an influence that we give and one that we receive on the job. We can be a part of a working relationship that can destroy us spiritually. (2 Cor 6:14-16)
- B. We need to see work as God does.
  - 1. The views of the work about why we work and our attitudes towards it is very different than that of the world. (**Rom 8:6-8**)
  - 2. The truth is that God is our real boss on the job! (Eph 6:5-8)
  - 3. Let us consider the proper attitude we should have towards our work.

### I. The Value God has placed on work

- A. God placed a great importance on work from the creation.
  - 1. God described creation as His "work." (Gen 2:2)
  - 2. Before the fall man was involved with work that involved both physical labor and mental labor. (Gen 2:15, 19-20)
  - 3. After the fall God emphasized the necessity of work and added difficulty to it. (Gen 3:17-19)
    - a. One of the consequences of Cain's sin was a fruitless labor. (Gen 4:12)
    - b. After the flood the people acknowledged the difficulty of work.
- B. How did God's Son spend the majority of His life? (Mk 6:3)
  - 1. He would have received the training from His father and spent most of His life with him in that work.
  - 2. Jesus was around 30 years old when He began to preach!
- C. Jesus used this background and history in His teaching.
  - 1. He spoke of wise and foolish builders. (Mt 7:24-27)
  - 2. He described landowners hiring workers. (Mt 20:1-7)
  - 3. He spoke of servants managing their master's money. (Mt 25:14)
  - 4. He spoke of farmers planting seed. (Mk 4:3)
- D. What should be our attitude towards work?
  - 1. The same as God! This is a matter of faithfulness. (2 Thess 3:10-12)
  - 2. We should approach work as God as our boss. We should give our best! (Col 3:22-24)

# II. Some challenges we must face at work

- A. Bitterness and envy
  - 1. How easy it is to become bitter at another who receives the promotion or recognition that you deserved! (1 Sam 18:7-9)
  - 2. This was also a motivation in the religious teachers who murdered Jesus. (Mk 15:10)
  - 3. I have seen Christian's act like the world when it comes to money and recognition. Whose praise should we seek? (2 Cor 10:12, 17-18)

### B. Stress and Worry

- 1. How many have not felt the paralyzing fear of not being able to pay the bills? (Mt 6:30-34)
- 2. We live in a society that may have a great economy but no security. One may lose their job without warning. (Ex. My own father)
- 3. Here is where we must learn to see things as God does! We need to be ready to accept the loss of a job and still have a contented life. (Phil 4:11-13)
- 4. Let us face our worry and know that all is well! (**Jn 16:33**)

# C. Maintaining Integrity

1. There is much we can do when we first take a job! Please do not try to hide your convictions to gradually bring out later. Notice the advice of Joseph. (Gen 46:31-34)

- 2. We must work the time we have agreed. Who is our boss?
- 3. We must be truthful, we must not take for personal use that which is another's.

# D. Daily Evangelism

- 1. We do not take a job to evangelize, but there will be opportunities. (Mt 5:14-16)
- 2. What opportunities do you have at work? (Ex. A weekly Bible study)

# III. Finding proper balance with our work

- A. Between dedication and workaholism
  - 1. Here is where we need to see clearly. (Mt 6:33; Ecc 6:7-9)
  - 2. Men in particular may find their lives completely defined by their work.
  - 3. Why are you here? What are you accomplishing by your life? What is first in your life?
  - 4. There is a particular danger here when you own your own business.
- B. Between ambition and contentment
  - 1. What are the limits to trying to get ahead? (1 Tim 6:6-11)
  - 2. How do we view and treat others in this pursuit? (Jas 2:1-6)
  - 3. How do we respond to setbacks in this area? (Ex. My father's loss of a business)

#### C. Between friendliness and compromise

- 1. We need to understand the temptations that come with the workplace.
  - a. You may have more companionship with a worker that with your mate! Watch out! (**Eph 5:3**)
  - b. Here is where a stand for the Lord will eliminate many problems.
- 2. Are you sensitive to the peer pressure of the group? (Ex 23:2)
- 3. Some need to understand their weaknesses and in some cases quit their current job and find another!
  - a. If my job affects my salvation then I need to find another.
  - b. If my job causes me to neglect my God-given family responsibilities then I need to find another.

## *Conclusion:* How do you view your job?

- A. We must not take the attitude of the world and hate our job and take advantage of the company.
- B. With God help we can find the wisdom to be content in our lives. (Lk 3:14)
