## Some Common Objections to Bible Baptism

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*Introduction:* You will not hear many that say they oppose baptism!

- A. The problem comes when we allow the Bible to define the subject, purpose and act of baptism that great opposition comes.
  - 1. Why is this so? Is the Bible not clear on the subject? No, God has made the way of salvation very clear. (1 Tim 2:3-4)
  - 2. The problem lies in the hearts of men who either will not search for the truth or have an agenda that they have placed above the truth. (2 Tim 3:1-2, 7)
  - 3. If you love the truth of God's word then be open to consider His choice on the matter.
- B. Whatever the Bible teaches about baptism there will be several things we will do in seeking the truth.
  - 1. We will seek out all verses on the subject. (Mt 4:4)
  - 2. We will draw conclusions about baptism in passages where baptism is mentioned.
  - 3. We will test our conclusions from examples found in the Bible.
  - 4. We will seek to bring all the Bible into harmony.
  - 5. We will not let the consequences of the truth nor the pressures of men turn us away from the truth! (Gal 1:10)

## I. The Bible teaches we are saved by faith alone.

- A. What do you mean by "faith alone?"
  - 1. The bible says that we are not saved by "faith alone." (Jas 2:24)
  - 2. The bible does teach that we are saved by faith. (Eph 2:8-9)
  - 3. We must conclude that we are saved by a living faith, a faith that will obey. (Jas 2:14-18)
  - 4. The question to be answered is this: "When does faith save?"
- B. Some passages that are commonly used.
  - 1. Does John 3:16 exclude baptism? No, because it would also by the same reasoning exclude repentance. (Acts 3:19; Lk 24:47)
  - 2. Did the jailer just believe? (Acts 16:30-31)
    - a. He had to be taught what to believe! What did he do immediately? (Acts 16:32-33)
    - b. When the jailer's actions were described, what had he done? (Acts 16:34)

## II. The thief on the cross was saved without baptism.

- A. This cannot absolutely be proved! Could he have received the baptism of John? (Mt 3:5-6)
  - 1. This is however a possibility. How can this view be sustained?
  - 2. Jesus saved men in various ways while on the earth. (Mt 9:6)
  - 3. He was born, lived and died under the old law! (Col 2:14-17; Heb 9:16-17)
- B. Our concern is the baptism of Christ and its purpose.
  - 1. His baptism is into Jesus' death. (Rom 6:3-4)

- 2. How could the thief be baptized into Christ's death before He had died?
- III. We should be baptized "because of" remission of sins, that is, we are saved first and then baptized.
  - A. Baptism is **for** the forgiveness of sins. (Acts 2:38-39)
    - 1. There are two possible meanings of the English word "for".
      - a. It can mean "because of". **Example:** "John was hanged for murder."
      - b. It can mean "in order to receive". **Example:** "John worked for \$5.00 an hour."
      - c. Whatever Baptism is "for" in this verse, is what repentance is "for".
        - "And" is a coordinating conjunction which connects two equal ideals or thoughts together.
    - 2. Anytime you find baptism and salvation or like blessing in a passage, baptism always occurs first.
      - a. Salvation (Mark 16:15-16, I Peter 3:21)
      - b. Forgiveness of Sins (Acts 2:38; 22:16)
      - c. Being Born Again (John 3:3-5)
      - d. Brought into Christ (Rom 6:3-5; 1 Cor 12:13)
      - e. A New Life, Rejoicing in Salvation (Rom 6:4; Acts 16:30-33)
  - B. Why did Jesus die on the cross, as only a sign or in order to provide our forgiveness? (Mt 26:28)
- IV. Those who claim baptism is necessary for salvation are preaching a works salvation.
  - A. There is a approach to God where a man tries to earn salvation (Eph 2:8-9)
    - 1. If it were possible to be saved this way, a man could boast in his effort.
    - 2. Some view salvation as an earnings from human merit. (Rom 4:2-4)
  - B. Some have concluded that any **conditions** of salvation must then be **a work of merit** and contrary to God's grace.
    - 1. How did the walls of Jericho fall? Were these conditions contrary to God's grace and an attempt at human merit? (Joshua 6:2-5; Heb 11:30)
    - 2. When one is baptized they do not look at God and say: "I have earned the right to my salvation! Look at what I have done." No, they simply are in faith receiving the gift of God based on His promises. (Col 2:12)
- V. Are you saying that those who disagree with you are going to hell?
  - A. Why is this question asked? Do you want to know the truth of stir up prejudice?
  - B. Ultimately we must yield to God's word on the matter! Both sides of this question cannot be right. At least one position has changed the gospel.
    - 1. God, not man, will be the final judge. (2 Cor 5:10)
    - 2. What if we have preached a perverted gospel? (Gal 1:6-9)
    - 3. Those who have a love for the truth will fervently try to correct those who are in error on this question rather than call them names and avoid them!

(2 Tim 2:24-26)

*Conclusion:* Have you been baptized into Christ? (Acts 19:1-5)
