### The Glory of God

Introduction: There are marvelous things that our God wishes us to see and know.

A. Paul described two kinds of people who are distinguished by what they see.

#### (2 Cor 4:3-6)

- 1. There are many who are blinded by Satan to the works of and the nature of our great God.
- 2. On the other hand the essence of the Christian's mind and life is simply proclaiming the wondrous things they see in our great God.
- B. What do we mean when we talk of the "glory of God?"
  - 1. Glory doxa ¤ AV glory 145, glorious 10, honor 6, praise 4, dignity 2, worship 1; 168 1) opinion, judgment, view 2) opinion, estimate, whether good or bad concerning someone 2a) in the NT always a good opinion concerning one, resulting in praise, honor, and glory 3) splendor, brightness 4) a most glorious condition, most exalted state.
  - 2. When we speak of God's glory then His power and attributes are shown in some way that result in men being in awe of Him.

# I. God's glory is shown to men that they might know Him

- A. In the calling and leading of Israel God often showed His glory. (Ex 24:16-17)
  - 1. Not only in the giving of the law but also in the provisions for the people was the glory of God manifested. (Ex 16:7,10)
  - 2. God's glory is of no profit to us however unless we come to trust Him.
    - a. Israel saw the glory of God again and again but never understood what God was like! They never humbled themselves and saw His goodness.
    - b. Why did God severely punish them when they refused to enter the promised land? (Num 14:20-23)
- B. God's glory ought to cause us to see our frailty and our need of Him.
  - 1. Look at the reaction that God sought in these people! (Deut 5:24-33)
    - a. God approved this reaction and pleaded for them to remember!
    - b. We need to sit up and listen when our God expresses such a desire.
  - 2. If they could always remember how helpless they were and how mighty and loving God is then all would be well. (Isa 63:12-14)

# II. Satan works to have men seek another "glory."

- A. What glory is greater than our God's? (Jer 9:23-24)
  - 1. God's glory is always sure, is always for our good and does not depend upon fickle changeable men.
  - 2. Still men have throughout history bought into foolish substitutes. (Jer 2:11-13)
- B. God knew that men are strongly attracted to their own glory.
  - 1. When did Gideon reduce his army so drastically? (Judges 7:2)
  - Over and over God judged nations and emphasized the vanity of the things they gloried in. You do not want to see the glory of God in judgment! (Isa 10:12-13; 16:14; 17:4; 20:5; 21:16-17; 22:18; 23:9; 28:1)
  - 3. One of the best things that can happen is for us to suffer and see the temporary

nature of those things men give their lives for. (Psa 138:5-8)

- C. To know God's glory will make us full of praise and purpose.
  - 1. Real security is found here. (Psa 73:24-28)
  - 2. Our hearts are filled with an optimism that never fades! (Isa 60:19-22)
  - 3. The evangelism of the child of God comes easy and the core message has always been the same. (Psa 86:3-13)
  - 4. Worship come naturally and often. (Psa 149:5; 105:3-5)

#### III. Jesus manifested the glory of God

- A. He is the fullest manifestation of God's glory we will see in this life. (Jn 1:14)
  - 1. What do we see in Jesus? What is the glory of God all about? (Heb 1:3)
  - 2. He was not moved by those things men glory in. (Mt 4:8-10)
- B. Those who sought another "glory" could not know Him and in time sought to kill Him.
  - 1. He challenged their hearts. What glory are you really seeking? (Jn 7:18-19; 8:50-51)
  - 2. They could not let go of the glory of men and as a result they could not believe in Jesus. (Jn 5:41-44)
- C. The heart of Jesus could be described as seeking the glory of God.
  - 1. Why was Jesus willing to die such a cruel death? (Jn 12:23-29; 13:30-34)
  - 2. At the end of His life there was one thing on His mind. (Jn 17:1,4-5)
  - 3. Where will the glory of God lead you in this life? The world will think you are crazy!

# IV. How may I show the glory of God?

- A. Understand that it does not come from my power or wisdom! (2 Cor 12:7-10)
  - 1. The opportunity to best show what God means to you comes in suffering.
  - 2. We often are mistaken about the things that really glorify God.
- B. When we "do all in the name of the Lord." (1 Pt 4:11)
  - 1. Those who submit to the king will find a uniform practice. (1 Cor 4:17; 7:17)
  - 2. When we change what god wants out of fear of being "traditional" we have left that which glorifies God.
- C. When our prayers are answered. (Jn 14:13)
  - 1. When we see our dependence upon Him and seek it!
  - 2. When He gladly provides that is a cause for His glory. Do we see that?
- D. When we respond in kindness to those who seek our hurt. (1 Pt 2:12; 4:12-14)
- E. When we show love to our "unlovable" brethren. (Rom 15:1-6)

# V. There is a glory that Jesus wants us to see

- A. Imagine the anticipation of Jesus showing us this glory! (Jn 17:24)
- B. Picture the awesome scene of judgment day. (2 Thess 1:9-12)

Conclusion: Have you seen the glory of God?

- A. If not then you are caught up in a rat race for things that will not last! (Rom 3:23)
- B. You are now presented with a glorious call. (2 Thess 2:13-15)
- C. Your life will be transformed each day as you see this glory. (2 Cor 3:18)
