Introduction: How does Satan work to destroy us?

- A. As a young Christian I did not understand the dangers in the works of the flesh. (Gal 5:19-21)
 - 1. It was hard for me to understand how men would be overcome by these things.
 - 2. I also thought that Christians would see their sin and repent and then move on!
 - 3. As years have gone by experience has taught me that the Lord's warnings were precisely where Satan could potentially defeat them.
- B. One of the most surprising truths I have observed is how these sins can take away the ability of a man to reason!
 - 1. Again as a young man all I thought I needed to do was find the proper reasoning and convince a person it was right and then they would obey!
 - 2. The Lord indeed wants us to help others to reason right.
 - 3. Jesus as the master teacher that knew men's hearts. He always saw the heart of the problem and sought to open the heart to expose it. (Lk 2:34-35)

I. The Danger of Sexual Sins (Gal 5:19)

- A. When you chose to enter a word of lies you may never come out.
 - 1. The only relationships that will last will have the love of God in it! (1 Cor 13:4-7)
 - 2. The dog-eat-dog relationships of the world cause you to live in a world of throw away people. Consider the fool Amnon. (2 Sam 13:12-15)
 - 3. The very nature of immorality involves hiding and deceit. (Prov 7:9-14)
- B. Who do you want to spend the rest of your life with?
 - 1. The sexual bond carries very strong emotional forces with it. God has designed it that way for marriage!
 - 2. Should you let "love" and passion determine a companion?
 - 3. The one who ignores God's way before marriage will likely do so after marriage in many ways. Proud people will never admit wrong! (**Prov 30:20**)
- C. Married couples need to always be on guard!
 - 1. One young woman I baptized years ago found an old boyfriend on the internet.
 - 2. An elder and I met with her several times and she admitted in tears that she was wrong and knew what God wanted. She would not do right!
 - 3. I will never forget the power of sin that had captured this young lady.
 - 4. It was in this same spirit that the idolaters sacrificed their children to Molech.
 - 5. One can lose control of their heart to the powerful thoughts of lust and infatuation. It is as powerful as drugs.

II. The Danger of False Religion (Gal 5:20)

- A. Whenever you enter any realm that runs from reason, you will be affected!
 - 1. The essence of idolatry is running from God and the pursuit of worldly pleasures. (Rom 1:21-23)

- 2. Our God gave us minds that with honest inquiry can find Him and His way! (Heb 11:6; Jn 7:17)
- B. The religions of the world operate "behind closed doors" and despise open debate and investigation. (Ezek 8:12)
 - 1. The world will try to close minds by dishonest whispering. (Acts 14:1-2)
 - 2. There are real dangers in the church where pride and bitterness are spread in secret and minds are shut down.

III. The Danger of Anger and Bitterness (Gal 5:20)

- A. Have you ever tried to reason with a "crazy man?"
 - 1. When one is filled with uncontrolled anger, Satan has control! (Eph 4:26-27)
 - 2. Bitterness will turn against any friend, break any commandment and even fight God without a blink of the eye.
- B. Most church splits have this spirit at the heart of the cause.
 - 1. You can be hurt by another and then act just like they do because of anger!
 - 2. Who do we want in control of our lives? (Rom 12:17-21)
 - 3. I want to warn our young about "anti-church" movements. Are you hearing about bad attitudes of others to stir you up to bitterness? You need to discern the difference between reason and shared anger. (Heb 12:14-15)
 - 4. There are many scoffers that post poison on the internet to appeal to pride and bitterness. Please do not join the scoffers. (Psa 1:1)

IV. The Danger of Addictions (Gal 5:21)

- A. Many have fallen to alcohol and drugs. (Prov 23:32-35)
 - 1. It is not uncommon in addictions to see buried anger and depression.
 - 2. This obsession like the others listed will pay any price for a temporary high.
- B. Dishonesty is a way of life for the addict.
 - 1. They deny its danger.
 - 2. They then deny the seriousness of their own situation. (Example: In Lincoln, "I do not have a problem!"
 - 3. Lying becomes a way of life. The biggest lie they tell to themselves!
 - 4. In short they trust no one who will tell them the truth and help.
- C. "Friends" and Associates go with drugs.
 - 1. One of the reason people start is to be with the "in" crowd.
 - 2. Sadly, this becomes a major hurtle to quitting.
 - 3. Many are blind to the "dog-eat-dog" nature of these people.

(John 15:18-19; 1 John 3:13)

V. How to come to your senses (Gal 5:22-26)
