Introduction: God has made man in a unique way. Unlike any of the animals we have a conscience.

- A. Our ability to be ashamed is a powerful tool in the Lord's hand.
 - 1. **Shame -** "A painful emotion caused by consciousness of guilt, shortcoming, or impropriety which appears in the countenance by blushing."
 - 2. We do not like to feel shame because it is painful!
 - 3. It is better to feel the pain of our conscience **before** an action, that **after** an action!
- B. Our shame is a product of our teaching and experience, either good or bad! (Rom 6:21-23)
 - 1. The gospel of Christ helps us to be ashamed when we should.
 - 2. Still the Christian must protect the conscience.
- C. Why we need a study of shame.
 - 1. The concept of shame is rapidly being lost.
 - a. Even the world acknowledges a place for it: "You ought to be ashamed!"
 - b. Sadly there are those who teach us to be ashamed of good things.
 - (Isa 5:20-21) (Ex. Ridicule of morals on TV talk show.)
 - 2. Shame can help us change. (1 Cor 6:5)

I. Why Do Men Feel Shame?

A. Because of the knowledge we have of right and wrong.

- 1. It is very common for new converts to say: "I never knew that it was wrong!".
- 2. Because of a lack of knowledge, they had no shame.
- B. Because of the **knowledge of others.**

1. The knowledge of other people.

- a. Many things are not shameful until others are present or have knowledge.
- b. Women Clothing, housekeeping.
- c. Men dirty car, foul-up at work.

2. The knowledge of God. (2 Cor 7:9-10)

- a. Example: Someone apologizing to men for taking God's name in vain.
- b. How can we develop a greater knowledge of God's presence?

(2 Pt 1:5-7)

- C. Why do some men not feel shame?
 - 1. By continued wrongdoing the conscience is destroyed. (Zeph 3:5)
 - 2. By sinking deeper into sin. (1 Tim 4:2; Eph 4:19)
 - 3. Do you remember the first time that:
 - a. You had a social drink?
 - b. Smoked the first cigarette?
 - c. Told a lie?
 - d. Engaged in immorality? Ex. Shoplifting

- 4. Have you ever asked of someone: "How did he/she get like that?"
- 5. The conscience is like an alarm clock. How many no longer hear it? Shame is valuable!

III. Things in which we should be ashamed.

- A. A Lack of knowledge of God's word. (2 Tim 2:15)
 - 1. Can you give book, chapter, and verse for the plan of salvation?
 - 2. Example: Some tests I have given. (1 Cor 6:5)
- B. To dress immodestly (1 Tim 2:9)
 - 1. You can overdress or under dress.
 - 2. Sad to see a couple who moved and started attending a "liberal" church. A very common aspect of liberalism is a complete neglect of modesty.
 - 3. What is God's standard for clothing? Are you concerning about what you wear?
- C. To speak of certain sins. (Eph 5:3, 12)
 - 1. Do you tell dirty jokes?
 - 2. What do you watch? Example: Movie in 1973.
 - 3. Should Christians ever watch an R rated movie? Should we show them to our children and their guests?
 - 4. Brethren there is very little good that comes from Hollywood. Watch your sense of shame! We may do well to disconnect our televisions!
 - 5. Is it all just a matter of "degree" dictated by culture or is there a principle of God that must not be compromised?
- D. Women speaking in the church. (1 Cor 14:35)
 - 1. This is a shame because of God's standard! (1 Cor 14:37)
 - 2. Many religions practice that which is shameful.
- E. A man to have long hair and a woman to have short hair. (1 Cor 11:15, 5-6)
- F. To place our trust in things that fail. (Isa 30:3; 1 Cor 1:27)
- G. False Religion. (Jer 10:14; 51:17; Hosea 9:10)

IV. How to maintain your sense of shame.

- A. Maintain and gain knowledge from God's word. (Col 1:9-10)
- B. Keep the right company. (1 Cor 15:33)
 - 1. "I will not be affected by going to ______ with my friends."
 - 2. What restraints are lost by wrong associations?.
- C. By maintaining a good reputation. (Ruth 3:11)
- D. By not being ashamed of good things.
 - 1. The gospel. (Rom 1:16)
 - 2. Faithful Christians. (2 Tim 1:8)
 - a. Example: A joke of a new convert.
 - b. Some do not want to be seen with there "lowly" brethren.
 - 3. To suffer as a Christian (2 Tim 1:12; 1 Peter 4:16)
 - 4. Of Christ and His will. (Luke 9:26)

Conclusion: God will never let you be put to shame, if you stand by His word.

(Joel 2:26-27; Rom 9:33; 10:11; 1 Pet 2:6)
