Introduction: Each of us have a "comfort zone".

- A. It is normal to develop these familiar paths to walk.
 - 1. What are your favorite things?
 - 2. If things change constantly we would be unhappy.
 - 3. New things require time and effort.
 - 4. Our confidence is slow to come with new things.
- B. There are times where must learn something that is new to us!
 - 1. Our Christian growth will commonly involve this. (Phil 1:9)
 - 2. Here is where many fail in their faith. It is always easier to return to the comfortable chair of the familiar! (Ex. Those who start a diet)
 - 3. It is true hard to make the changes that will be life long.

I. Examples of Those Who Were Destroyed by the Familiar

A. The Children of Israel.

- 1. The children of Israel were given a new life by Moses. (1 Cor 10:1-4)
- 2. Consider the great blessings, they were delivered from bondage and were heading to the promised land! What could stop them?
- 3. Their hearts were not converted to the Lord. (1 Cor 10:5-6)
- 4. What were the evil things that they turned to? They were: fish, cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions, and garlic. (Num 11:4-6)
- 5. How could these things destroy them? The familiar was more important than the eternal.

B. The Jews who would come to Christ.

- 1. The Jews persisted in attacking both Jesus and John the Baptist, why?
- 2. Their hearts were not prepared to accept the New Covenant! (Luke 5:33-39)
- 3. If they were to come to God major changes would have to take place. What did they do? They chose to be hyper critical of Jesus to destroy His influence.

C. Some who begin the Christian Life.

- 1. The Christian life is described as a complete change. (Gal 2:20)
- 2. There is a great temptation to return to what we know. (Luke 9:57-62)
- 3. What is best? What does God want? Or what am I used to?

II. Some New Things We Must Learn in Christ

A. How to have a new heart.

- 1. All those converted to the Lord have had their hearts crushed to be replaced by a new one. (Ezk 36:25-27; Psa 51:10)
- 2. How do I know I have such a heart? All things have become new! (2 Cor 5:17)
- 3. Have you become tired of the gospel? Are you excited about working in the kingdom of God? (Ex. First day on a new job.)

4. Now each day we must renew it! (Rom 12:2)

B. How to worship each day.

- 1. God is seeking a certain kind of people, is this you? (John 4:23-24)
- 2. A man lectured on "the baby boom generation within churches of Christ" and concluded: "change the worship". There is another alternative, change the heart.
- 3. Worship must be taught. (Luke 11:1-3)
- 4. We must learn things new to us that are old to God, prayer, meditation, application, and how to worship daily. Worship is work!

C. How to work with other people.

1. The early Christians were closely associated with one another.

(Acts 2:42, 46-47; 9:27-28)

- 2. We must learn a difficult lesson when we work with others, how to deal with hurt and disappointment. (Eph 4:31-32)
- 3. It is easy to go back to the "dog eat dog" approach of the workplace and of the world.
- 4. Do not go back to the familiar! Let us help others. (Heb 12:12-13, 15)

D. How to maintain the morals God has given.

- 1. It has never been more difficult to maintain moral convictions in this country, there is so much peer pressure.
- 2. We must "unlearn" the world's standards and learn God's.

(1 Pet 4:3-4; Eph 4:25-28)

3. It is easy to go back to the familiar! (Ex. Lies)

E. How to be strengthened by the one hope.

- 1. God has given us a tremendous hope based on strong evidence. (1 Pet 1:3-5)
- 2. This hope can change our live if we would focus on it and not the familiar!

F. How to develop new talents in the Lords service.

- 1. Often God will increase our ability if we would seek to work. (1 Cor 15:58)
- 2. Once you become a Christian you must move forward, not back to the familiar.

III. How to Overcome the Familiar

A. Seek and hold onto that which is true. (1 Thess 5:21; 2 Thess 2:15)

- 1. Always be seeking God's will.
- 2. Once you know it is right, do not let go!

B. Be determined to make your change permanent. (Heb 10:35-39)

- 1. The Jewish Christian has to learn this. It was hard!
- 2. If you will hold on, the change will become part of you. (ex. New job I hated.)
- C. Do not give up because of setbacks. (John 21:15-17; 1 John 1:7-9)
- D. Make your heart right with God each day. (Psa 119:11)

Conclusion: Are you afraid of change? We all are.

- A. If the Lord tells you to change then we can trust Him. (Heb 11:6)
- B. Christian are you looking for greater opportunities of service?
