In Search of The Servant of God (Part 2- Isaiah 49:1-11)

Introduction: How could God's coming Servant be known?

- A. The problem for man is that he cannot think like God. (Isa 55:8-9)
 - 1. We are very limited. Consider someone from 150 years ago coming here and the <u>difficulty he would have in understanding!</u> (Ex. book, 1921)
 - 2. The <u>most spiritual man would struggle</u> to understand the message, while a worldly man would scoff at and then oppose God's servant. (Lk 23:34)
- B. At the time of Isaiah, Israel was told in advance many "<u>unthinkable" things</u> that would come.
 - 1. Babylon would <u>destroy Jerusalem</u> and take them into captivity. (Isa 39:5-7)
 - 2. Israel would be restored after 70 years by one named Cyrus! (Isa 44:28)
 - 3. God wanted the nations (from afar) to be looking! His power shown in these things was meant to *get their attention for something much greater*.
 - 4. These unparalleled events in human history would <u>pale in comparison</u> to the coming Servant! (Isa 49:1-11)

I. The Servant would come in the fullness of time (49:1-2)

- A. God wants the nations <u>to be in anticipation</u> of these events. (Isa 49:1-2)
- B. This Servant was for a time *in the shadow of God's hand*.
 - 1. He was like a concealed weapon, *hidden until the right time*.
 - 2. Satan was *a willing tool in his own demise*. What he thought was a victory was a defeat! (Heb 2:14; 1 Cor 2:7-8)
 - 3. This is the significance of the "mystery" in God's plan. (Eph 1:9-10)
- C. Consider the power of <u>revealing Jesus at this time</u>. (Gal 4:4-5)
 - 1. The gathering of some of Israel <u>had taken place</u>.
 - 2. The hypocrisy and *corruption of present Israel was obvious*. Men longed for their version of the Messiah.
 - 3. Jews were <u>scattered over the world</u> and would be used! (Rom 1:16)
 - 4. The *Roman government* would provide a common government and language as well as a great transportation system. Paul often used this!

II. This Servant that seeks to glorify God will also suffer (49:3-6)

- A. "In whom I will be glorified" perfectly describes this Servant! (Isa 49:3, 5)
 - 1. <u>How</u> does one glorify God? (Jn 12:26-28, 31-33)
 - 2. God spoke directly from heaven to affirm the value of glorifying Him. This involves a complete denial of self and suffering! *It is worth it*!
- B. This Servant will be tested and will suffer. (Isa 49:4)
 - 1. The struggle between laboring "in vain" and knowing his "just reward" with God is the exact battle that *took place on the cross*.

- 2. Jesus used <u>the knowledge of God's character</u> and His promises to stay the course! (Psa 22:1-3, 6-8)
- C. This Servant was assured what His suffering would accomplish. (Isa 49:5-6)
 - 1. What things do we endure in this life because we look to an outcome?
 - 2. What did Jesus *know* He would accomplish? (Heb 12:2-3)
 - 3. Do you see how this Servant would *mold a people to be like Him*?
- D. Consider *the enormity* of gathering Israel together again. (Isa 49:5)
 - 1. Israel, since the days of Solomon was divided and worldly. The righteous were *greatly troubled* by what they saw!
 - 2. Now imagine being crushed, brought into captivity and scattered among the nations! How *can it be brought together again*?
 - 3. This would be a very different gathering than under the 1st return.
- E. This gathering will *also involve the Gentiles*. (Isa 49:6)
 - 1. It would <u>an impossible thing</u> for men to just bring the Jews together. When it comes to God's power it was "too small a thing!"
 - 2. How can you bring people from <u>different cultures and speech together</u>?

III. This Servant will build an impossible highway (49:7-11)

- A. This was a highway that accessed the fallen of the earth to <u>bring them to the</u> <u>power and salvation of God</u>. (Isa 49:7-11)
 - 1. There *will be great opposition*. His way will be abhorred.
 - 2. Many will yield to follow this servant, both great and small!
 - 3. How can any highway cross *mountains, oceans and the barriers of men*? **(49:11)**
- B. This Servant lives forever and will becomes the covenant of God! (Isa 49:8)
 - 1. Do not miss this highway! There <u>is only one</u>! (Jn 14:6)
 - 2. God strengthened Jesus to <u>provide salvation for us</u>! (2 Cor 6:1-2)
 - 3. This highway has instructions (a covenant) and God's grace is there!
- C. The favoritism and prejudice of men have no place here.
 - 1. This highway is based upon a holy heart and <u>not education, power and riches</u>. This is a highway of holiness! (Isa 35:8-10; Eph 3:3-4)
 - 2. The despised and imprisoned ones are equal with kings. All <u>are treated</u> the same! (Isa 49:7; 35:3-6)
- D. The provisions on this highway will be completely sufficient. (Isa 49:10)
 - 1. Jesus made it plain that <u>all we need</u> is the revealed words of God. (Jn 12:46-49)
 - 2. When this true light has been revealed, then *everything else is darkness*.
 - 3. In *the next servant song* we will learn more about this "light of men" in contrast to the "light" men make in their own wisdom
 - 4. The highways men build leads to *a very different place*.
- E. It possible for people at anyplace and at any time to serve Him! (Mt 28:18-20)
